Abstract

The decision to take up sport or post-compulsory education is often influenced by our social and gendered origins. In two case studies, women in orienteering (qualitative study) and immigrants in their educational orientation (quantitative study), we will understand how socialisation, stereotypes and the environment influence individuals' choices. Women get involved in this sport thanks to men, but practice it differently depending on the context.

Immigrants are more likely to take up professional studies, especially in a context where there is a high concentration of immigrants (segregation).
